Making an Even Greater Impact for Life

As I reflect on all God has done through Care Net Pregnancy Services of Northern Kentucky, my heart is filled with gratitude for you. Your prayers and support sustain this ministry and allow us to reach thousands of women, men and families with the message of hope and life. Because of you, 2,200 babies have been saved, parents equipped and families strengthened. God is truly at work through your partnership.

The need for life-affirming services in our community continues to grow. Each week, women find us online and walk through our doors, sometimes afraid and uncertain. We meet them with compassion, offering free pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, parenting classes, life skills and material support while sharing the love of Christ. To meet growing demand, we increased staffing again this year so every client receives the care and attention he or she deserves.

Through August, we have seen remarkable growth in client care this year:

- Client visits for all services are up 9%.
- We have performed 240 ultrasounds, revealing 186 viable pregnancies.
- Of the viable pregnancies, 97% chose life.
- Total babies saved from abortion through Care Net's ultrasound program: 2,200!

Slammed doors. Angry words. Defiant kids. Frustrated parents. It's a scene families often know too well.

For 34-year-old Ryan (not his real name), what he calls "a toxic divorce" made parenting all the more difficult.

"After the divorce, there was constant chaos, going back and forth," Ryan said.

Things boiled over one day when Ryan's kids were at his house. His 10-year-old son was in his bedroom playing video games on his phone.

"My son was cussing at the game," Ryan said. "I told him to stop and he wouldn't, so I yelled for him to bring the phone to me. He threw the doors open, threw the phone at me. It hit me in the face. Then we were just screaming at each other."

Ryan's ex-wife heard about the incident and Child Protective Services (CPS) became involved.

CPS ordered Ryan to take anger management and parenting classes. For the latter, he came to Care Net and enrolled in 1-2-3 Magic. The program's 14 lessons teach "limits with love" and how to create an environment where discipline is quick and easy so parents

can enjoy their children. Ryan's mentor was 10-year veteran Carson Latham.

Having CPS involved was difficult, but Ryan says he's really grateful now.

"In the classes I learned different techniques, like how to cool down a heated situation and to notice when the kids are manipulating or trying to play one [parent] against the other. Things are easier now between my ex and me.

Tax Break by the Acronyms

What's RMD? RMD is Required Minimum Distribution. Owners of traditional IRAs, 401(k)s and similar plans must withdraw a specified amount annually beginning at age 73. RMDs are taxable.

What's QCD? QCD is Qualified Charitable Distribution. Generally, QCDs allow those age 70½ or older to make a tax-free donation from an IRA to a qualified charity.

How are QCDs and RMDs related? A QCD counts toward satisfying your RMD for the year but is not included in taxable income. If you're subject to RMDs, you can use a QCD to partially or fully satisfy your RMD for the year.

IRS rule: to count toward an RMD, a QCD must be made first. You can't apply a QCD to an RMD retroactively.

Talk to your financial advisor about taking some of the sting out of taxes by supporting Care Net.
